

RE: Revision to PharmD Dual Degree Program Course Requirements

The College of Pharmacy offers several dual degree programs in conjunction with the Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) degree. An element of these programs is the ability for courses that are required in the PharmD degree to satisfy curricular components (e.g., electives, prerequisites, required courses) of the corresponding masters degree program. The PharmD program is in the midst of implementing a new curriculum, and thus the coursework that the dual degree partners consider suitable to meet the masters program requirements has changed. Thus, we seek approval for minor revisions to the course requirements for the following programs:

The College of Pharmacy offers a dual degree option for a portion of the students in the Doctor of Pharmacy Program to, in addition, earn a Masters of Science Degree in Pharmaceutical Sciences. A component of this program has been to allocate specific courses from the Pharm.D. professional program to also satisfy the curricular requirements of the Masters Program. Because the College of Pharmacy has instituted a new curriculum, we are in need of revising the selection of courses that will now be used for dual credit.

The following courses have been approved by the Graduate Faculty of the College of Pharmacy as serving the dual degree:
