2. Overview of Changes

Describe the rationale for the changes, including results from the most recent program review if applicable. (450 word limit)

This proposal is for a small change to the current Political Science curriculum for both the B.A. and the B.S. in Political Science. The core Political Science requirements are not being changed, the proposal only alters the list of courses outside the major accepted for a B.A. or a B.S. in Political Science. The number of credit hours is unchanged.

Background: As part of the Political Science major, students are required to complete 15 credits from courses outside the major. Students must complete this requirement by selecting courses from an approved list of courses that supplement the Political Science education. This requirement also requires students to take at least 6 credits within one department prefix, 6 credits from another prefix, and then 3 additional credits. We are moving to update this part of the degree requirements as it has become a bottleneck for our majors and is needlessly confusing. First, the current list of courses is outdated and was written in a very narrow fashion. Many of the courses on the current list are no longer offered making it difficult for Political Science majors to complete this requirement. Further, the current list does not accurately capture the varying subjects that would be of value for Political Science majors.

Proposal: The Political Science Department has created a new list of acceptable courses from outside the major and elminated the mixed pairs requirement. The new list expands the topics students can take by incorporating a broader array of courses. We had a faculty committee review courses across campus and decide which had application to PS. Some departments have 200-level courses that are relevant so we included them in the list. Unlike some departments that simply say any 300-level or above course, we really tried to examine what courses were out there and tailor what we would accept for our degree. The new list is also designed to be easier to administer as we would now accept a broad range of courses from departments instead of selecting just a few courses. Thus, we will not need to revise the list as courses are cancelled or added across campus. Second, we are doing away with the mixed pairs. This requirement confused students and creating difficulty in the advising process. Since we could find no rationale for this extra hurdle, we are removing it.
