rarely used in sociological research. Our Research Methods course (SOC 302) focuses on survey, interviewing, and participant observation methods which are used by most sociologists today. Thus, a course in experimental research design is not equivalent to SOC 302.

This change is a minor one which will not significantly change the structure of the major. The required credit hours will not change, except to be slightly reduced at the upper possible limit (from 12-14 to 12-13) because PSY 215 is a 4 hour course and SOC 302 is a 3 hour course.
