# 14. Rationale for Change(s) – if rationale involves accreditation requirements, please include specific references to that.

The current major allows students to take as many as half of their credit hours (21 of 42 credit hours) outside of the department at the 200+ level and offers no tracks. While no empirical data have been collected to determine how this has affected our students' language proficiency and understanding of the field of Hispanic Studies, we felt the need to 'reclaim' a large portion of those credit hours and to offer tracks. Hispanic Studies is a very broad field that includes not only the development of functional proficiency in Spanish but also an understanding of Spanish linguistics, culture, and literature. Moreover, we strive to develop these complex understandings via coursework delivered almost exclusively in Spanish rather than English. While we value the multi-disciplinary nature of the current major, the department felt it was necessary to expose our students to more Spanish and to more aspects of the Spanish language, its literatures, and its cultures, especially given the status of Spanish as the unofficial 'second' language of the United States, by increasing the number of credit hours taken within the department. Furthermore, a recent external review of the department pointed out the imbalance in coursework mentioned above and recommended a dramatic change in favor of more SPA coursework, particularly given our recent expansion of offerings in linguistics and translation. In order to offer a more coherent program of study to those students who may be interested, the Department will offer 3 tracks as noted to be listed on the official transcript. These tracks serve two purposes: 1) they provide programmatic coherence by allowing students seeking acceptance to graduate school or employment in a certain area to present evidence of discipline-specific preparation, and 2) they allow for a "General" option so students not desiring to specialize are given a broad exposure to Hispanic Studies.


