#### World Theatre III 1800-1950 TA 371

<u>Course Description</u>: A multicultural and transnational examination of the history, theory, dramatic literature, and practices of theatre from 1800-1950. The third of four courses in a four-semester sequence of World Theatre.

During the course of the semester, we will discuss various ideas relative to the countries and to the theatres we study. Among these will be: independence and democracy; colonialism and imperialism; anti-colonialism and the search for identity; industrialization and mass culture.

<u>Learning Outcomes:</u> Upon the completion of the course, students will be able to:

- 1) describe the key identifiers for each period, e.g. the guiding purpose for the theatre; theatre architecture and staging, major playwrights and plays
- 2) analyze the ways in which the theatre situated major historical events, philosophies, and discoveries in its plays, personalities, styles, etc.
- 3) understand dramatic literature as an index of culture
- 4) conduct primary research and three-dimensional research pertaining to this period of theatre

#### Tentative Schedule:

- Weeks 1-9 European and English-Speaking Theatre
  Romanticism, Melodrama, Popular Theatre, Amateur Theatre
  Realism, Non-realism
- Weeks 10-11 Latin American Theatre
  Golden Age and Neoclassical, Romanticism, Zarzuela,
  Popular Entertainments, Domestic Comedies, Experimental,
  Political Theatre. Negrito Plays, Burlesques
- Weeks 12-14 African Theatre and Performance

  Traditional forms, Colonial influences, Anti-colonial theatre
  Professional Troupes, amateur companies, Opera, festivals

Week 15-16 Asian Theatre
