In Spring Semester 2011, the Department of Theatre submitted a proposal to allow students enrolled in our B.A. Degree program to "use 3 credit hours of course work within their Major Requirements to fulfill General Education Requirements", thus limiting their ability to "double dip" major courses in the UK Core to 3 credit hours. The faculty imposed this limitation for our students along with two other units in the College of Fine Arts, Art and Arts Administration before we had a clear idea of the variety of courses that our students would typically take in the impending UK Core curriculum. This was also prior to our major B.A. Degree curriculum revision that was approved in 2013 based on our accreditation by the National Association of Schools of Theatre. We have subsequently come to understand that we are one of only three units across campus that have this limitation in place (all in the College of Fine Arts), and now also understand the

The faculty in the Department of Theatre and Dance have multiple reasons for requesting this change. First, at least half of our majors are transfer students, many of which transfer from another unit on University of Kentucky campus. They may have developed their interest in our program through one or more UK Core classes that they take in Theatre and/or Dance. When one of those students decides during their sophomore or junior year to change to or double major in our program, they are, in effect, penalized for their involvement in our program. In fact, several students who I recently advised subsequently elected not to major in theatre in order to avoid having to take additional UK Core classes to fulfill our degree requirements in General Education.

According to Mike Shanks, Student Services Director in the Office of the Registrar, there is no other program that limits students in this way other than Theatre & Dance, Art, and Arts Administration. Our limitation provides serious issues with APEX, forcing registrar staff to physically input each of our students' UK Core classes into the system one at a time and makes advising students accurately extremely difficult. It also, according to Shanks, creates confusion within APEX for students transferring in or out of the program, and actually penalizes them for electing to major in Theatre.

Our goal at this time, which is in alignment with and inspired by university-wide initiatives on retention and four-year graduation rates, is to provide the most comprehensive and flexible program of study for our students. With our 45-credit hour major, most of our students elect to double major and/or minor in other areas across the university. The flexibility for them to "double dip" in the UK Core within our degree program is an important step to allow them to continue their progress toward graduation.

Thus, the faculty of the Department of Theatre and Dance are requesting a change in the current limit to the number of Theatre and Dance classes can take to fulfill their UK Core requirements and would prefer that students can take unlimited credit hours within their Major Requirements to fulfill General Education Requirements.
