Recommendation from Senate's Rules and Elections Committee Regarding *Senate Rules 10.3* ("Senate-Approved Policy for Determining Meeting Times and Number of Credit Hours for Courses")

Issues regarding SR 10.3 – See below. These came up in an SREC discussion of draft rule changes being proposed by the Senate's Distance Learning and e-Learning Committee.

Motion: Grossman moved, Bird-Pollan seconded to refer issues about SR 10.3 to the Senate Admissions & Academic Standards Committee (SAASC) for review and possible correction. The SREC unanimously approved the motion.

These include:

a. In some places in SR 10.3 the calculation is incorrect of the number of educational activity hours needed to attain the shown number of hours to justify award of 1 credit hour.

b. matching the number of educational activity of otherwise equivalent courses in which one meets three times a week for 50 minutes and the other meetings twice a week for 75 minutes.

c. resolving the effect the different number of official class days in the fall semester vs. the spring semester on the total required educational activity hours per credit hour.

d. providing a clear explanation for how the considerations in SR 10.3 relate to University accreditation.
