## Items for the Senate Council arising from the Sept 9, 2019 SREC Meeting

## Re: SR 5.4.2.2 concerning college professional program-level honors

**Background**. There was a question at a spring 2019 Senate meeting as to whether any college professional degree program has established its own program-level honors, that would appear on the transcript/diploma. Senate Rule 5.4.2.2 has since 1982 provided for the professional degree of a college to establish college professional program-level honors. So far as the SREC has been able to determine, only one professional degree (DMD, College of Dentistry) at this time uses such a set of honors ("Distinction, High Distinction").
