Hey Sheila,

Proposal Name: Proposed Changes to PhD Sociology

This is a recommendation that the University Senate approve the College of Arts and Sciences request to change the 2<sup>nd</sup> year paper and oral defense requirements, and course requirements for the PhD program in Sociology.

Rationale: The existing requirements mandated a second year paper and oral defense for an MA as a part of the PhD program. The program faculty have decided that this requirement is an unnecessary burden for students that do not need the MA degree. The second year paper and oral defense are still required for students who leave the program with a Master's degree, or for PhD students wishing to earn the MA degree prior to completing the PhD. Additionally, the course listing reflects a slight change in course requirements that reflect a change to the research design sequence. The number of credit hours is unchanged.

10. Qualifying examination requirements:	Consistent with the Graduate School rules, qualifying exams (written and oral) can cover any material deemed appropriate by the student's advisory committee. The student and their advisory committee design the core reading list for their specialization. The student's advisory committee will create, administer, and evaluate the written qualifying exam and administer and evaluate the compulsory oral exam. The Department authorizes two exam procedures. First, the written exam can be closed book and last up to eight hours per day for two days. The two exam days must take place within seven working days. The student will answer two of four questions each day. Second, the written exam can be a take-home open book exam to be completed in fourteen calendar days upon receiving the questions.  The written portion of the qualifying exam will include questions in the specialization area with some choice offered to the student (some questions may be required). The recommended number of questions to be answered for both the take-home and the open-book exam format is four. For the take-home option, students will be expected to write approximately 12-15 page responses to each question, excluding references. The	no change

total page count of the exam will not exceed 60 pages, excluding references. The exam responses will be double-spaced, with 1-inch margins, using 12-point font.

The oral portion of the exam must be held within 2 weeks from the date of the written portion of the exam. Classes must be in session, for the student to sit for the exam. Students should register for SOC 767, residency credit, for the semester in which they are taking the exam. Students who need to switch from SOC 767 to independent study course(s) because of the failure to take a qualifying examination as originally planned must enroll in SOC 792 under the section number of the Sociology DGS.

Dear Camille,

I am writing to confirm that the Sociology Department faculty met on October 15, 2018 to discuss proposed changes to SOC 680 and SOC 780. The faculty voted unanimously (12-0-0) to change the official listing of the research design requirement to be SOC 680 for 3 credits, which is current practice, but this eliminates the current distinction between SOC 680 (2 credits) + SOC 780 (1 credit).

In addition, at the October  $15^{th}$  meeting, the faculty voted to accept the proposed changes to the Graduate Student Handbook regarding the  $2^{nd}$  year paper: i.e., removing the text stating that the MA is only an option in the  $2^{nd}$  year. This proposal passed with a vote of 11-1-0.
