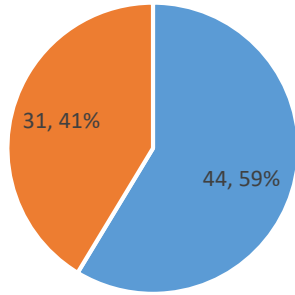


Shared Governance at Land Grant Universities

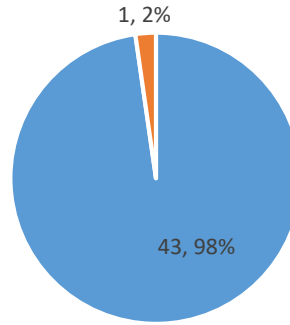
My colleague, Dr. Eleanor Johnson, and I (Eric Blalock) quantified elements of shared governance at U.S. Land Grant Universities. Land Grant Universities were defined by the National Institute of Food and Agriculture. We excluded Community Colleges, Colleges that were not in a University system, and 31 Universities that either did not have policies posted, or for whom board approval was not clear. Board-approved policies were defined as subsections of policy manuals, regulations, or individual policy documents. *(Please note that we are not expert in this type of analysis. This is a first blush attempt to appreciate the complexity of UK's shared governance in the context of that at other Land Grant Universities.)*- 10/22/2021

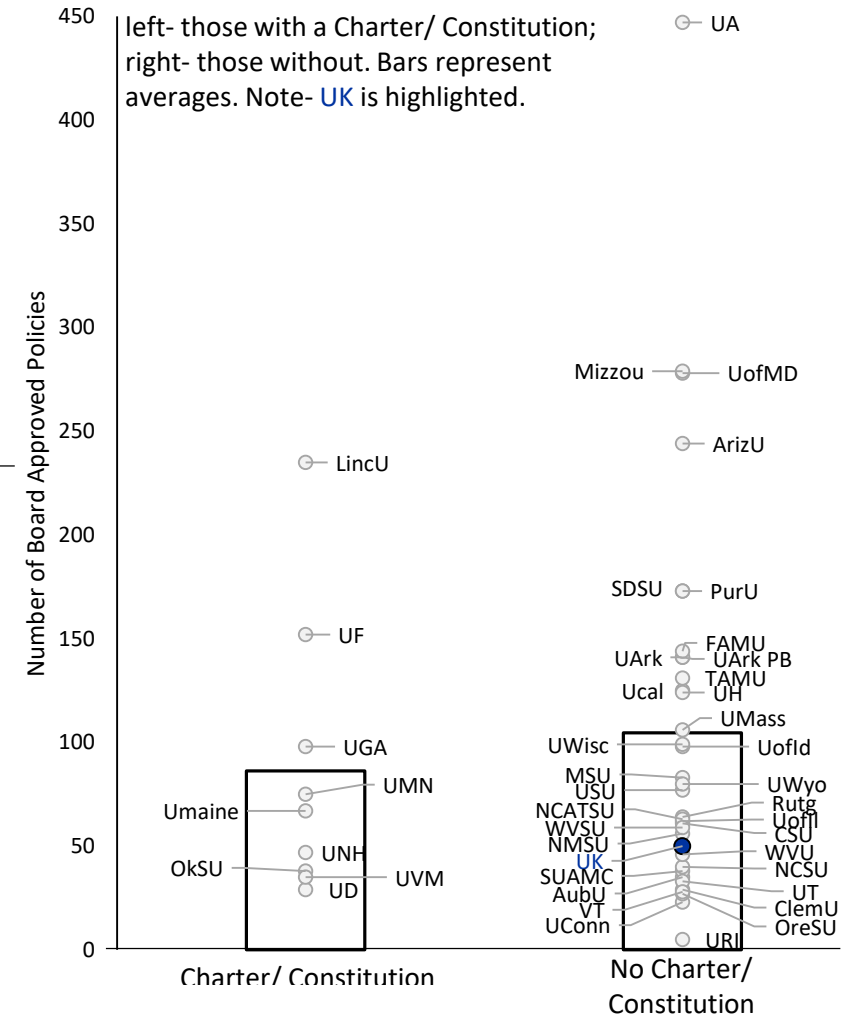

All But 1 Land Grant Universities Have a Faculty Senate (not shown- all had a Student Senate)

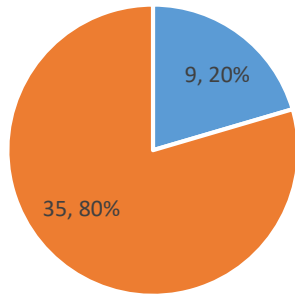

of Board Approved Policies for Each Land Grant University

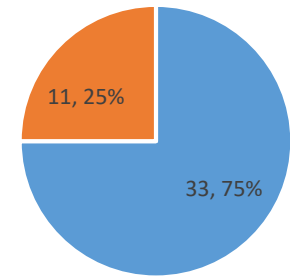


35/ 44 Land Grant Universities Do NOT Have a Charter or a Constitution
