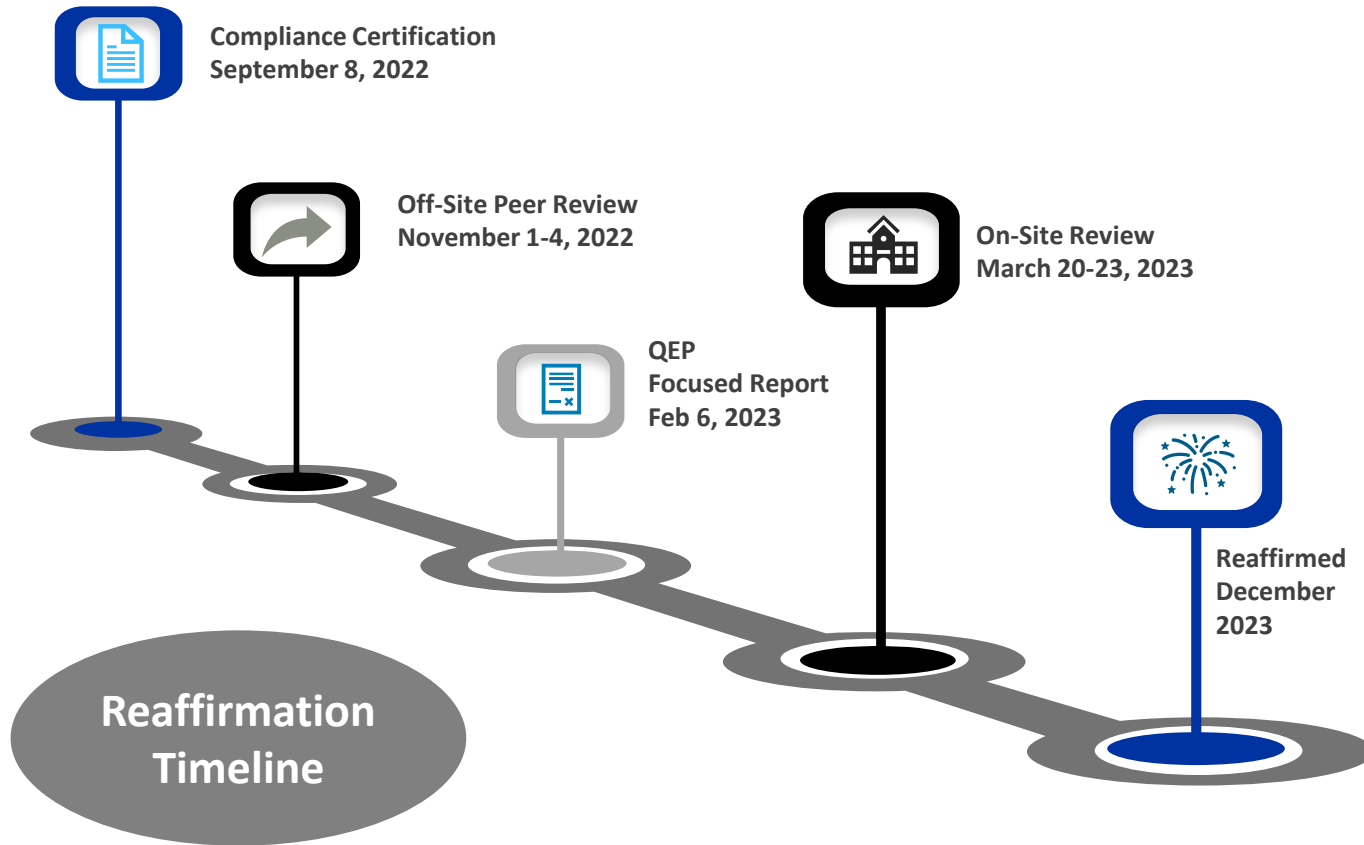

Proposed Revisions: GR I: University Definition

- Update name of College of Law to “J. David Rosenberg College of Law” in definition of University
- Add Lewis Honors College to definition of the University
- Updated title in Campus Sales section from “Director of Student Center” to “Executive Vice President for Finance and Administration”.
- “Eliminated section on Solicitation of Funds, which is no longer used or necessary
- Update Vision Statement to be consistent with the Strategic Vision Statement approved as part of Strategic Plan



Proposed Revisions: GR II: Audit and Compliance Committee

- Changed Title of “Chief Audit Executive” to “persons with responsibility for accountability and compliance”



Proposed Revisions: GR IV: University Senate

- Removed “Associate Provost for Undergraduate Education” from Senate Membership, as that position no longer exists
- Added Dean of Lewis Honors College to Senate Membership
- Corrected titles that have changed, such as College of Agriculture



Proposed Revisions: GR XI: Student Affairs

- Changed all references from Vice President for Student Affairs to “Vice President for Student Success”
- Updated references to the documents entitled “Student Rights and Responsibilities” to *AR 4:10 Code Student Conduct*



University of Kentucky Governing Regulations (GR)

Kentucky Law (the Kentucky Revised Statutes - KRS) empowers the UK Board of Trustees to adopt regulations for the operation of the University.

- KRS 164.180(1) - “The board of trustees ...shall adopt such bylaws, rules, and regulations consistent with this chapter as it deems proper.
- KRS 164.200 - “The board of trustees may establish proper regulations for the government of the university and the physical training, military or otherwise, of the students.”

The Regulations adopted by the Board pursuant to these statutes are the UK *Governing Regulations (GR)*.



Governing Regulations - Delegation to the President of the University

Through the GRs, the Board of Trustees authorize the President to adopt:

- *Administrative Regulations,*
- *Human Resources Policies and Procedures*
- *Business Procedures Manual*

to implement and interpret the GRs.

GR III The President of the
University of Kentucky, GR
XIII University Regulations)*



Governing Regulations - Delegation to University Senate

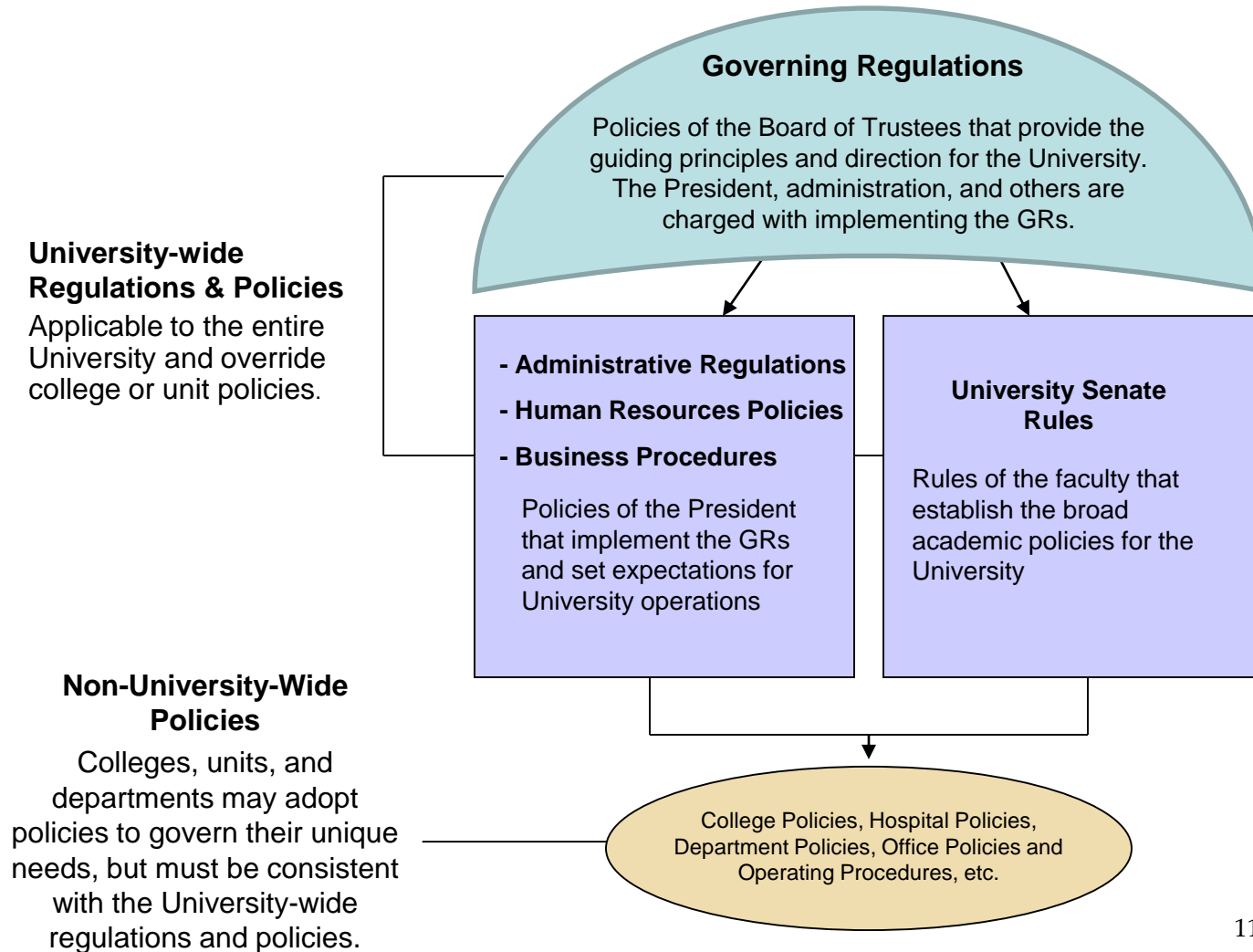
Through the GRs, the Board of Trustees authorize the University Senate to:

- Determine the broad academic policies of the University*
- Develop University Senate Rules for the conduct of its functions**

*Functions of the University Senate are found in GR IV.

Revising Governing Regulations (GR XIII)

- The Board of Trustees makes final approval of GRs.
- GRs may be amended at any meeting of the Board of Trustees provided at least one (1) month has elapsed between proposal of the amendment(s) and final passage. (1st & 2nd Reading)
- The President, the University Senate, the Staff Senate, and the Student Government Association, as appropriate, shall have an opportunity to recommend on all amendments before final action by the Board of Trustees.
- As the basic law of the University, the GRs supersede any previously approved rules or regulations in conflict therewith.

THE GOVERNING REGULATIONS



[Governing Regulations](#)

Umbrella policies of the Board of Trustees that provide the framework for administration to implement and comply with the intent of Board Policy. Policies that define requirements or constraints that impact the University's overall mission, operation, or governance.

THE ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS



[Administrative Regulations](#)

Policies of the President that implement the Governing Regulations and provide for the general administration and oversight of the University.



[Human Resources Policies and Procedures](#)

Policies and procedures relating to employment with the University for all employee groups, except that certain policies for faculty are contained in the Governing and Administrative Regulations.



[Business Procedures Manual](#)

Policies relating to the University's accounting, budgeting, procurement, travel, and other financial functions.
