Proposed New University Scholars Program: BA Linguistics and MA Linguistic Theory and Typology

This is a recommendation that the University Senate approve the establishment of a new University Scholars Program: BA Linguistics and MA Linguistic Theory and Typology within the Department of Linguistics within the College of Arts & Sciences.

Proposed New University Scholars Program: BS Linguistics and MA Linguistic Theory and Typology

This is a recommendation that the University Senate approve the establishment of a new University Scholars Program: BS Linguistics and MA Linguistic Theory and Typology within the Department of Linguistics within the College of Arts & Sciences.

Rationale for both programs:

Many linguistics majors consider going on to complete graduate work in Linguistics, and the USP provides these students with the opportunity to pursue a Master's degree in Linguistics at an accelerated pace. Students who complete the USP will be exceptionally well positioned to continue graduate work toward the PhD; to enter other graduate programs of study (such as Law or Business); or to seek employment for which a Master's degree in Linguistics will be beneficial.

NEW UNIVERSITY SCHOLARS PROGRAM (USP)

The University Scholars Program (USP) offers students the opportunity and challenge of integrating their undergraduate and graduate courses of study into a single, continuous program leading to both a baccalaureate and master's degree. The student's particular requirements will determine the amount of time needed to complete the program, but the two programs can be completed in less time than that required in a conventional program.

Once approved at the college level, your college will send the proposal to the Graduate Council (GC) for review and approval. (Requirements for the bachelor's degree must remain unchanged, so there is no review by the Undergraduate Council.) After approval by the GC, the GC will send your proposal to the Senate Council office for additional review via a committee and then to the Senate for approval. Once approved by the Senate, the Senate Council office will report approvals to the Provost, Registrar and other appropriate entities, including the contact person. The contact person listed on the form will be informed when the proposal has been sent to committee and other times as appropriate.

2. OVERVIEW

2a	Provide a brief description of the proposed USP. (300 word limit)
	An applicant to the USP will be a Linguistics major in the spring of her/his junior year, and will meet the minimal requirements of the Graduate School. Once accepted into the program, in the first year of the USP the student

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may take up to 12 hours of graduate coursework that can be counted toward both the BA/BS and MA requirements. He/She will also complete any outstanding BA/BS requirements. In the second year of the program, the student will complete the remaining 18 hours for the MALTT degree (Master's in Linguistic Theory and Typology). Participation in the USP does not change any undergraduate degree requirement, or any graduate degree requirement.

2b Explain the need (e.g. market demand). (300 word limit)

Many Linguistics majors consider going on to complete graduate work in Linguistics, and the USP provides these students with the opportunity to pursue a Master's degree in Linguistics at an accelerated pace. Students who complete the USP will be exceptionally well positioned to continue graduate work toward the PhD; to enter other graduate programs of study (such as Law or Business); or to seek employment for which a Master's degree in Linguistics will be beneficial.

2c Describe the target audience. (150 word limit)

The USP is intended to serve high-achieving Linguistics undergraduates who may already enter UK with credit for prior learning, and who know at an early stage in their undergraduate career that they are interested in pursuing graduate work in Linguistics. Successful applicants to the USP will be able to complete the Bachelors plus Master's degree in one less semester than is usual, since 12 credit hours are permitted to count for both the graduate and undergraduate degree. The USP benefits students by enabling them to save both time and tuition in completing the BA/BS and MA in accelerated fashion.

5. ADMINISTRATION AND ASSESSMENT

5a Describe how the proposed USP will be administered, including admissions, student advising, retention, etc. (150 word limit)

The USP will be administered primarily by the Linguistics departments Admissions and Awards committee, which oversees admissions for the graduate MALTT program, and by the Director of Graduate Studies. Students interested in applying to the USP will confer with the DGS, prior to applying; the A&A committee will review the student's application material. Once admitted, the student will be advised by the DGS regarding the MALTT curriculum, and also by his/her undergraduate advisor to ensure that requirements for the BA/BS degree are met. The DGS and DUS will review undergraduate, USP, and graduate retention data periodically and share information annually with the faculty.

5b Describe evaluation procedures for the proposed USP. Include how to determine whether the USP is a success or a failure. (250 word limit)

The USP will be evaluated by the Linguistics department's Curriculum committee to ensure that the recommended curriculum remains timely and up-to-date. The achievement of Student Learning Outcomes for the BA/BS degree is assessed annually by a committee headed by the DUS, and the graduate program is assessed annually by a committee led by the DGS. Numbers of students applying, accepted, and enrolled in the USP will be reported annually by the DGS to the faculty. Their progress through the combined Bachelors+MA program will be tracked. The USP will be considered a success if 80% of students enrolling in the USP complete their Masters degree within 2 years of completing the BA/BS.



Notes on the undergraduate curriculum:

‡ Incoming students do not have to enroll in CC1 (CIS/WRD 110) if they have any of the following: 1) An ACT English score of 32 or higher; 2) an SAT Verbal score of 700 or higher; 3) or a score of 4 or 5 on the English Language AP exam. In these situations, the student should replace CIS/WRD 110 with electives.

* To be discussed with your academic advisor.

† The linguistics major requires completion of the 4th semester college-level language.

◊ 6 hours of 'free' electives - that do not count toward any other requirement - must be taken. Additional electives may be required to reach the required minimum of 120 hours. Consider pursuing a 2nd major or minor.

Notes on the USP curriculum:

- Students must apply to the graduate program in the spring of the JUNIOR year for acceptance into the University Scholars Program (USP).
- Courses highlighted in YELLOW are those that count toward BOTH the undergraduate degree and the graduate degree. The student is advised to discuss the senior year course schedule with the undergraduate advisor and with the Director of Graduate Studies in Linguistics.
- The graduate degree requires 30 credits of course work, of which 12 may be taken in year four. Thus 18 credits must be taken in year five in order to graduate in 4+1 years with both Bachelor's and Master's degree.
- AT least 15 credits must be taken at the 600 or 700 (counting toward the graduate degree), including those taken for graduate credit in Year Four.
