The SAASC convened on Friday, April 13, 2018 to consider a proposal from the College of Engineering, Department of Chemical and Materials Engineering (Chemical Engineering program) to change credit hours to 128.

Attendance: Dan Morey, David Hulse, Dan Howe, Kevin Donohue, Brad Kerns, Rebecca Kellum, Herman Farrell (Chair), Annie Davis Weber (ex-officio).

Procedure:

Herman Farrell acted as facilitators of the proposal.

Discussion:

Farrell noted that this proposal is similar to other proposals from the College of Engineering recently approved by the SAASC, SC and US involving a reduction in total credit hours for a specific engineering program in order to comply with a CPE mandate that the total credit hours not exceed 128. The supportive elective (3 credit hours) will no longer be required. This proposal also involves reducing the credit hours of two core chemical and engineering courses from 4 credit hours to 3 credit hours. The committee confirmed that the reduction in credit hours for those courses had been approved through SAPC.

Vote:

A motion was made and seconded that the SAASC approve the proposal from the College of Engineering, Department of Mining Engineering to change credit hours to 128.

The committee voted 7 in favor, 0 opposed.
