The Director of Undergraduate Studies (DUS) for the AEC program will jointly supervise the University Scholars Program with the Director of the Patterson School. Applicants must follow the application procedures and meet the admission standards for both the Graduate School and the Patterson School. Students admitted to the program will be assigned a Patterson School faculty advisor who will advise students during the graduate portion of the program. For the remainder of their undergraduate program, students will continue to be advised by their undergraduate academic advisors. The DUS in AEC and the Patterson School Director will monitor retention rates for the program.

Describe evaluation procedures for the proposed USP. Include how to determine whether the USP is a success or a failure. (250 word limit)

The primary method for determining the success of the USP will be the graduation rates of those participating in the program. Further indications of success will be the number of students obtaining employment related to their areas and levels of study after graduation. This information will be gathered via social media outlets (LinkedIn, Facebook, etc.), discussion with facaulty who served as advisors for their programs, and/or directly from the alumni.



students who have come to UK with very solid academic preparation, due to rigorous high school academic programs or independent work. Many of them have earned a significant amount of AP credits. Normally, these students are ready to start taking graduate classes in their second or even in their first year, and in these classes are completing the same amount and level of work as graduate students. The University Scholars Program is a highly effective and beneficial opportunity for academic challenge and growth for students with proven record of academic excellence. In fact, the existence of the University Scholars Program is for us a powerful recruiting tool, with which we are able to attract excellenct undergraduates from all over the country - students, who would have selected other major universities for their undegraduate studies, had this program not existed. Normally, a faculty member identifies among the students appropriate candidates for the program and directs them to talk with the Director of Undegraduate Studies and the Director of Graduate Studies. These students show excellent performance in their classes, and usually have GPA of 4.00 or close. The DUS, DGS and the student consult together and thus a decision is made for the student to apply for USP (this happens upon completion of 90 credit hours). The DUS, DGS and the student devise an individual plan of studies. In the plan, twelve credit hours are being communicated between undergraduate and graduate degree. Depending on the individual plan of study, the student completes both degrees in four (with significant AP credits awarded upon entry to UK) or in five years.

2b Explain the need (e.g. market demand). (300 word limit)

This program was initially approved in 1983. However, paperwork documenting that approval by the University Senate has been lost, so that we were requested to resubmit the program. Currently, there are four University Scholars in Classics, all of whom are making the expected progress toward degree. The USP is of tremendous importance for attracting excellent students from all over the country to our university. Many students with strong high school academic record and proven academic excellence choose UK especially because of the opportunity to complete an M.A. degree together with their B.A. and would not have opted to come here, had this opportunity not existed. Completing a Master's degree together with the Bachelor's allows the University Scholars to be very competitive for the job market upon their graduation from the University of Kentucky. The most usual career paths lead to high and middle school teaching positions, or to pursuing a doctoral degree at a major university, as well as to work in translation services, international businesses, government sector and non-governmental organizations.

Undergraduate students with strong record of academic excellence, who are ready to take courses on a graduate level and to complete work designed for graduate students, as well as who have high motivation to complete a Master's degree at the same time or immediately upon the Bachelor's one.

Faculty members identify particularly strong students from their classes and direct them to the DUS and the DGS. Upon conferring with the student, the DUS and DGS prepare an individual plan of study. Then the student applies both to the University Scholars Program and to the Graduate School. After the student is admitted, both the DUS and the DGS cooperate as advisors and work together with the common goal of completing the path of studies and of timely graduation.

Describe evaluation procedures for the proposed USP. Include how to determine whether the USP is a success or a failure. (250 word limit)

Every year, while working on the graduate assessment, the Program evaluates the state of the University Scholars Program. This evaluation includes assessment of the progress of each and every University Scholars toward degree. It is expected that all University Scholars should follow the designed plan of studies and make the anticipated progress toward degree. If this expectation is fulfilled, the USP meets established outcomes. An additional tool for evaluation of success is career path after graduation. If every University Scholar obtains a job corresponding to their qualifications, e.g. an appropriate high/middle school teaching position, or enters a doctoral program for continuation of studies etc., the USP meets established outcomes.



Total 30 hours required. Half of them need to be on a 600 level. Two thirds of them need to be in Classics. Two thirds of them need to be in regularly scheduled courses. CLA 501 is required. A student must earn a minimum of nine credit hours in graduate courses in each of the classical languages and an additional six credit hours in graduate courses in either Greek or Latin or a combination of the two. A student needs to pass an M.A. exit exam.

In order to evaluate the status of the Computer Science USP program and its success, the Department of Computer Science will analyze time-degree data for our USP graduates, review our USP drop out rate, and take note of our enrollment numbers in the USP program, in light of our USP students successfully completing the rquirements and core educational values and goals of the Computer Science undergraduate and graduate degree programs. The data will be assessed every semester with respect to the graduation rate and student performance as key indicators, and improvement actions will be developed and implemented as needed.



The program allows for particularly gifted and advanced undergraduate students to complete the requirements both for a B.A. and an M.A. degree in either five years, or, for highly motivated students, in four years. These are

students who have come to UK with very solid academic preparation, due to rigorous high school academic programs or independent work. Many of them have earned a significant amount of AP credits. Normally, these students are ready to start taking graduate classes in their second or even in their first year, and in these classes are completing the same amount and level of work as graduate students. The University Scholars Program is a highly effective and beneficial opportunity for academic challenge and growth for students with proven record of academic excellence. In fact, the existence of the University Scholars Program is for us a powerful recruiting tool, with which we are able to attract excellent undergraduates from all over the country - students, who would have selected other major universities for their undergraduate studies, had this program not existed. Normally, a faculty member identifies among the students appropriate candidates for the program and directs them to talk with the Director of Undergraduate Studies and the Director of Graduate Studies. These students show excellent performance in their classes, and usually have GPA of 4.00 or close. The DUS, DGS and the student consult together and thus a decision is made for the student to apply for USP (this happens upon completion of 90 credit hours). The DUS, DGS and the student devise an individual plan of studies. In the plan, twelve credit hours are being communicated between undergraduate and graduate degree. Depending on the individual plan of study, the student completes both degrees in four (with significant AP credits awarded upon entry to UK) or in five years.

2b Explain the need (e.g. market demand). (300 word limit)

This program was initially approved in 1983. However, paperwork documenting that approval by the University Senate has been lost, so that we were requested to resubmit the program. Currently, there are two University Scholars in French, who are making the expected progress toward degree. The USP is of tremendous importance for attracting excellent students from all over the country to our university. Many students with strong high school academic record and proven academic excellence choose UK especially because of the opportunity to complete an M.A. degree together with their B.A. and would not have opted to come here, had this opportunity not existed. Completing a Master's degree together with the Bachelor's allows the University Scholars to be very competitive for the job market upon their graduation from the University of Kentucky. The most usual career paths lead to high and middle school teaching positions, or to pursuing a doctoral degree at a major university, as well as to work in translation services, international businesses, government sector and non-governmental organizations.

Describe the target audience. (150 word limit)

Undergraduate students with strong record of academic excellence, who are ready to take courses on a graduate level and to complete work designed for graduate students, as well as who have high motivation to complete a Master's degree at the same time or immediately upon the Bachelor's one.

Faculty members identify particularly strong students from their classes and direct them to the DUS and the DGS. Upon conferring with the student, the DUS and DGS prepare an individual plan of study. Then the student applies both to the University Scholars Program and to the Graduate School. After the student is admitted, both the DUS and the DGS cooperate as advisors and work together with the common goal of completing the path of studies and of timely graduation.

Describe evaluation procedures for the proposed USP. Include how to determine whether the USP is a success or a failure. (250 word limit)

Every year, while working on the graduate assessment, the Program evaluates the state of the University Scholars Program. This evaluation includes assessment of the progress of each and every University Scholars toward degree. It is expected that all University Scholars should follow the designed plan of studies and make the anticipated progress toward degree. If this expectation is fulfilled, the USP meets established outcomes. An additional tool for evaluation of success is career path after graduation. If every University Scholar obtains a job corresponding to their qualifications, e.g. an appropriate high/middle school teaching position, or enters a doctoral program for continuation of studies etc., the USP meets established outcomes.







	The Department of Family Sciences offers undergraduate, Masters and doctoral degrees that prepare students to work with families in a wide range of settings. Current enrollment figures indicate there are 108 undergraduate students, 21 Masters program students and 19 doctoral students enrolled in the department. With a proposed new Family Sciences option in Consumer Economics and Personal Finance (CEF) the undergraduate enrollment is expected to increase substantially over the next five years. Ordinarily the Masters degree requires two years for completion. 





MUS USP ADDENDUM:

Regarding part 4b (specific course requirements), I have listed some courses but need to clarify the matter further:

- 1. Undergraduate bachelor of music students are required to complete either MUS 572 or MUS 573 (3 credits total) as part of their BM degree, and graduate students in the master of music degree or master of arts degree may count this as 3 hours of required elective coursework toward their degree, so long as it is completed with a grade of B or better. The two courses MUS 572 and MUS 573 are both called 'counterpoint,' though one is taught in spring of even-numbered years, the other in spring of odd-numbered years. Either course satisfies the course requirement for the BM degree, and either course can be used toward 3 hours of elective coursework for the MM degree. Perhaps both courses should be listed within this range of courses, but in practice only one will be shared between degrees for students engaged in the USP.
- 2. MUS 578 can fulfill 3 credits of required coursework in music theory for the MM degree, and by petition, this course can be used to replace the MUS 372 (music analysis) course requirement for BM students. The MUS 578 course duplicates much of the course material, and far surpasses the rigor of, the MUS 372 course. I have included it here for this reason, though students would need to be aware that they must file a petition with the CFA undergraduate advisor to allow the MUS 578 course to stand in for the MUS 372 course.
- 3. I've listed the course MUS 50x, with the title "Music History coursework" on the form, for 3 hours. There are a number of music history courses offered at the 500-level, including MUS 501, 502, 503 504, 505, 506, and 507 offered in alternating semesters, any of one of which can fulfill 3 credits of graduate coursework in music history for the MM degree, and any one of which fulfill 3 credits of required. If needed I can list each and every one of these classes, but in practice only one will be shared between degrees for students engaged in the USP.
- 4. I've listed MUP 5xx, with the title "Applied studio lessons in instruments or voice, offered at graduate credit" for a total of 3-6 credit hours. BM students are required to complete 6 credit hours each (2 semesters each at 3 credits each) of applied studio lessons at the 100, 200, 300, and 400 levels. By petition to the undergraduate advisor, students may substitute up to 6 hours of 500-level lessons for those at the 400-level, meaning that students in the USP program will complete 500-level lessons during their senior year in place of the planned 400-level lessons, which overlap with 6 hours of required coursework in applied music study at the 500-level for the MM degree. Students must be graded at the graduate level during these semesters of 500-level lessons. Students in MA degree plans may count these 500-level lessons toward their elective requirement for the degree.



At this point, the student would continue doing graduate-level coursework to earn an M.A., following one of three existing M.A. tracks and completed relevant language requirements as outlined in the current version of the *Graduate Handbook* for History (pp. 7-11). In doing so, the student would have already earned 12 hours of graduate-level work, including at least 6 hours at the 500+ level and at least 6 hours at the 600+ level, that could be counted towards the M.A. degree as appropriate. Excerpts from relevant portions of the *Graduate Handbook* for History are appended.



program works on the assumption that students entering the University will begin Spanish coursework at the 300 level, either through placement exams scores or AP/IB/dual credit coursework completed in their secondary school curricula. The first four semesters will consist of undergraduate coursework both in and outside of the Hispanic Studies department, while the last four semesters will see the students working almost exclusively within the department at both the undergraduate and the graduate level.

2b Explain the need (e.g. market demand). (300 word limit)

Increasingly, we are seeing students who arrive for their first year at the University with second-semester freshman or sophomore status from their AP/IB or dual credit coursework in high school. These high-achieving students seek ways to maxmize their time here at the University and distinguish themselves from other graduates as they look to join the workforce or continue their studies. This program provides that opportunity to students who have advanced language skills in Spanish. It also provides the University with additional tools to recruit these high-achieving students and retain them for the full four years.

2c Describe the target audience. (150 word limit)

Students who have an interest in Hispanic Studies and advanced Spanish language skills, who will be able to start in 300-level courses in their first semester. These students may be bilingual speakers, heritage speakers who have placed into upper-level course through placement exams, or native English-speakers who have studied Spanish at high levels in their secondary school programs.

Students who have the language skills and academic rigor to complete the program will be identified by the faculty advisors in Hispanic Studies and invited to apply for the USP after their third semester of coursework at the University. Once admitted to the graduate program, students will be advised by the Director of Undergraduate Studies, in consultation with the Director of Graduate Studies, for their junior year and the Director of Graduate Studies for their senior year in the program. Students will be encouraged to study abroad in the second semester of their second year of coursework at the University, to further develop oral proficiency and overall facility in Spanish, in preparation for graduate-level courses in the first semester of the third year of University study. Study abroad experiences are a factor in retention and overall student success as they increase student proficiency and confidence in Spanish-language environments.

Describe evaluation procedures for the proposed USP. Include how to determine whether the USP is a success or a failure. (250 word limit)

The Director of Undergraduate Studies, the Director of Graduate Studies and the Department Chair will evaluate the efficacy of the program and identify areas for improvement on a biannual basis and will report their findings to the Hispanic Studies faculty at a regularly-scheduled faculty meeting. Criteria for determining the relative success or failure of the program will include quantity of student participation, quality of student performance in the program at the 400, 400-G, 500, and 6/700 levels, and post-graduate admission and job placement of successful graduates from the program.

6. MISCELLANEOUS

6a Is there anything else about the proposed USP that should be mentioned? (150 word limit)

This will be an excellent tool to recruit high-achieving students and allow them to explore beyond the limits of standard Undergraduate education. It has the potential to work well in conjunction with the newly-established Lewis Honors College. However, there are logistical problems for these students, who often come to the University with scholarships for undergraduate coursework. If those scholarships do not extend to graduate coursework, this becomes difficult to promote.





Once approved at the college level, your college will send the proposal to the Graduate Council (GC) for review and approval. (Requirements for the bachelor's degree must remain unchanged, so there is no review by the Undergraduate Council.) After approval by the GC, the GC will send your proposal to the Senate Council office for additional review via a committee and then to the Senate for approval. Once approved by the Senate, the Senate Council office will report approvals to the Provost, Registrar and other appropriate entities, including the contact person. The contact person listed on the form will be informed when the proposal has been sent to committee and other times as appropriate.
