Proposed Significant Changes to MS: Kinesiology and Health Promotion

This is a recommendation that the University Senate approve the significant changes to the MS: Kinesiology and Health Promotion, in the Department of Kinesiology and Health Promotion within the College of Education.

Rationale: The significant changes are to establish four concentrations in Biomechanics, Coaching, Exercise Physiology, and Physical Education Teaching. These concentrations have existed informally, but formally establishing these concentrations will allow the concentration to appear on students' transcripts and for clearer communication with potential employers about the students' backgrounds. Kinesiology and health promotion is a broad term, encompassing many areas, and establishing the concentrations will strengthen students' marketability for career opportunities.

It would also enable us to list Biomechanics on the transcript as the degree conferred. Currently, the M.S. degree that our students complete is titled: Kinesiology and Health Promotion. This requested program change is to formalize an option in Biomechanics so that the information stated on the students' transcripts includes "Biomechanics." It is to be reinforced that these requested changes are specific to the Biomechanics option only. While it may seem redundant to individuals not in these specialized areas, kinesiology and health promotion are two different fields and should not be considered one in the same, particularly considering the multitude of degrees offered within these areas and those seeking jobs within these specific areas. Our goal for conducting these revision is to strengthen our students' marketability for career opportunities. Our Biomechanics option (only) curriculum will not be changed yet we would like to highlight the core (or required) courses for biomechanics.

RE: Change in Kinesiology and Health Promotion M.S. – Adding Formalized Options

The Physical Education Teaching faculty is requesting to update our curriculum for our graduate students in order to formalize the option for emphasis in Physical Education Teaching. We currently have a general M.S. degree in Kinesiology and Health Promotion, but the different discipline options (emphasis areas) have not been formalized. It would also enable us to list Physical Education Teaching on the transcript as the degree conferred. Currently, the M.S. degree that our students complete is titled: Kinesiology and Health Promotion. These requested changes are specific to the Physical Education Teaching option only. While it may seem redundant to individuals not in these specialized areas, kinesiology and health promotion are two different fields and should not be considered one in the same, particularly considering the multitude of degrees offered within these areas and those seeking jobs within these specific areas. Our goal for conducting these revisions is to strengthen our students' marketability for career opportunities.
