Proposed Significant Change to MBA: Business Administration (One-Year and Evening)

This is a recommendation that the University Senate approve the significant changes to the MBA: Business Administration (One-Year and Evening) in the Gatton College of Business and Economics.

Roshan-

The one-year MBA program is a 51 credit hour program while the evening MBA program is a 36 hour program (the main difference is the project connect part of the one-year program, which is the experiential learning class). There are 4 elective classes in the one-year program and 3 elective classes in the evening program. For students in the entrepreneurship concentration MBA 646 will be their capstone course in the program, so it is considered a required course not an elective. So the entrepreneurship concentration will have 3 elective courses. Currently, MGT 699 is the capstone course for the program (for both one-year and evening) and will remain so for the students not in the entrepreneurship concentration. The MBA policy committee and Gatton faculty have approved all of these changes.

In addition to the 3 new entrepreneurship courses, here is the list for the other elective courses in the program:
