## Areas of Concerns

Low participation rates

Wide variability across courses

High rates of unusable artifacts

## Low

Participation Rates

1. Stronger buy-in from instructors, including graduate students
2. More encouragement from DUSs, chairs, deans, and Provost

3. Sanctions to those courses that fail to participate in two consecutive cycles of assessment, e.g., loss of Core designation?

- Qualtrics survey on how the information is used.

## Wide Range of Ratings

- Rewards to high performing courses/instructors/program

## Effective Rubrics / Process

- Timely revision \& distribution of rubrics by UKCEC
- Feedback from evaluators, instructors, DUSs, Chairs, and Associate Deans to UKCEC
- Periodic discussions between UKCEC and stakeholders about UK Core
